

Summer 2019 – Initiatives for Youth

Summer Work Experience

- VR supported
 - Approximately 250 students around the state
 - Paid at minimum wage
 - Employment in the community
 - Some school programs, some individual placements
 - Built-in employability class
 - Great feedback

Step Up Program

- Pilot Year Held at UMaine
- Participants had a diagnosis on the Autism Spectrum
- Partners: Center for Community Inclusion and Disability Studies and Maine Autism Institute for Education and Research
- Paid work experience
- 3 credit Psychology course
- Instruction in Social Skills and College Readiness

Progressive Employment

- Adapted from successful Vermont-developed model
- Early engagement
- Informational interviews, business tours, job shadows, paid work experience
- Different way of partnering with the business community
- Everyone is ready for something!
- Pilot for transition-age youth in Portland and Lewiston
- Over 800 youth and young adults have participated in Progressive Employment activities to date!
- Expansion to Bangor and Augusta under TWBL grant

The Benefit Counseling Program through Maine Medical Center

-funds free Benefit Counseling Services for SSA Disability recipients state wide

-provides training and technical assistance to over 100 people a year on Work and Benefit Navigation; now over 400 people become navigators dispelling work myths and offer guidance to the people they support

Joint Work of DHHS and DOL

Employment Workforce Development System

- Certifies at least 25 new Employment Specialist a year
- Provides Advanced training for employment staff Building Supports in the Workplace, Supporting people around employment who have behavioral needs, Technology and Employment, Career Planning
- Hosts monthly webinars on employment
- Administers the College of Employment Support
- Coordinates registries for staff and training calendar

OADS-Employment Services

- Intake and Eligibility staff now share employment pathway, VR brochure and Benefit Counseling information at Intake
- PCP process and employment planning and barrier identification
- Waivers 18, 20, 21 and 29 all have
 - Career Planning new training, new options for Community Support programs
 - Work Supports- can be used in self employment also
 - Employment Specialist- can be used to switch to another similar job

OADS – our focus for employment 2019/2020

- Ensuring all waiver members have access to employment planning and services, with trained staff and agencies available statewide in conjunction with VR
- Additional training for Case Managers and Care Coordinators
- Resources and Support to all Community Support programs to create access to employment (HCBS)
- Evergreen system will have enhanced employment tracking- on a pathway and employed (data)
- Transportation to employment- options available to members



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
